a message from the CAA's president, Tom Burgess ...

It's all good!

Being from Virginia, the birthplace of eight presidents, I enjoyed touring a carriage museum with two presidential carriages in its collection. The Penrose Museum located next to the Broadmoor in Colorado Springs has many jewels gathered within its walls.

William Henry Harrison's 1841 Williamsburg Brougham was part of history, as it was used in his inaugural parade. After giving the longest inaugural address of two hours, President Harrison, the ninth President of the United States, became the shortest-term president in office, as he died one month later of pneumonia. The 1862 Brewster C-Spring Victoria once belonged to President Chester A. Arthur, the twenty-first president. Both of these vehicles provide studies that only original carriages can do. I would love for someone to photograph and publish a book of all of the Presidential carriages, their stories, and their current locations.

Other vehicles of note among the thirty-one horse-drawn carriages included a two-wheeled Brewster cart with mail hubs, an 1890 Gentleman's Drag, and, not to be overlooked, two Abbot-Downing Company historic pieces. These were an 1857 Concord Coach and an 1895 Yellowstone owned by "Buffalo Bill" Cody. Jason Campbell, the museum's curator, told stories of adventures on the stage coach and tips given to travelers of the day. I will cite several of these tips: Don't keep the stage waiting. Don't spit into the wind. Don't point out where murders have been committed, and if the team runs away, sit still and take your chances.

So, why was I in Colorado? The CAA Board of Directors recently approved the [Colorado Driving Society](#) as one of two driving clubs to become new CAA Chapters. The other club is in Hawaii. I enjoy sharing the activities and adventures of the CAA with our new chapters.

Susie Haszelbart made this meeting happen for Gloria and me. She contacted Fred Wehrli,

the CDS president, about my interest in speaking. Soon I was on my way. Fred was instrumental in fulfilling the local logistics of the CAA Conference in Estes Park many years ago.

Susie also made the arrangements with Jason for us to visit the Penrose Museum. The Rocky Mountain Carriage Club joined with the CDS for the museum visit and then later for my presentation. Upon the conclusion of my talk, I presented to Fred the CAA banner and letter of chapter acceptance. Five club members became new members of the CAA that day. Welcome, CAA friends! Let's hope we see the RMCC's application for board approval in January. It's all good for me to be a part of bringing the CAA farther into the West.

Many of you may remember Susie Haszelbart through her appearance at the CAA Carriage Festival or the Walnut Hill Driving Competition. I met her at the 2014 CAA Carriage Festival, where she was competing with her Haflinger put to a Brewster wicker carriage. She traveled two and a half days to join us and participated in the Ladies Wicker Park Phaeton Division. Commitment is Susie's middle name.

Less than a month after hip surgery, long time CAA member Erik Jensen is back driving his four-in-hand of Hackney/Clyde horses. Here is a man who, along with his wife, Mary, has frequently traveled East with horses to CAA events since the 1980s. His carriage collection ranges from a Park Drag to a racing sulky. The Jensens' daughter, Kris, with the assistance of Jennifer, prepared the team of horses for a two-hour drive through the beautiful Rocky Mountain scenery. It was a delightful day of CAA members enjoying a day of companionship and appreciating the joy of carriage driving.

I left home with the goal to share through my presentation an understanding of the activities "Inside the CAA." I returned home safely and, to quote Susie, **"It's All Good."**



1. Guidelines for organizers, a sample budget, and reimbursement forms are available on the CDS web site. They're on the right hand side in the "Documents" section below the newsletters.
2. Three months before your event, submit a budget to the CDS board.* No publicity for an event will be released until YOUR BUDGET HAS BEEN SUBMITTED.
3. Two and a half months before your event, submit a description of the event to the newsletter editor.* Include title, date, time, location, rain date, fees, organizer, details of the event, closing date for entries & where to send fee & registration. (Please send content with minimal formatting. We'll take care of the layout.)
4. If you need help recruiting volunteers, contact the volunteer coordinator* with a list of the volunteers you need (set-up, scribe, timer etc.) .
5. After your event, please send results and a report to the newsletter editor.*
6. Sending photos is highly encouraged.
7. If you incur an expense that needs to be repaid out of the club's checkbook you must provide a receipt. There is a form available for this on the website, and we will have them at the membership meetings. Items that are donated require a receipt for the value of the item and the word "Donated" written on the receipt for tax purposes. This can include a judge's fee if the judge normally charges but chooses to donate the service to CDS.


