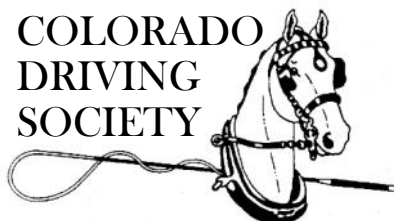

Painting Your Vehicle

In 1865, J.B. Brewster & Co. charged \$260 for a small coupe to be repainted. The high cost reflected the time spent painting a vehicle correctly.

Tips to make painting easier:

- Wrap your brush in plastic wrap or aluminium foil to keep it ready for work the next day.
- Practice, practice, practice! For each step in the painting process be sure to practice on a spare piece of wood first.
- If the iron work cannot be removed, the adjoining wood should receive two coats of varnish. That way you can wipe off any excess paint from the iron pieces without effecting the grain of the wood.

The intent of our Annual Easter Egg Hunt is to have fun, to offer an opportunity for fellow enthusiasts to visit, and to offer a safe environment for our equine partners to refresh themselves after the winter doldrums. Everyone is welcome to join CDS and enjoy the fun!!

How it works:



- Arrive at 10 am or before to decorate your carriage and/or horse/pony/mini/mule/burro/children
- Secure your horse.
- Sign in (& pay your \$25 club dues, if you haven't already.)
- Get your number tags.
- Tie one tag to your cart and one to your basket. (or to yourself if you're ground-driving, in which case an apron with a pocket for eggs may be helpful.)

11 am Potluck Brunch

- Bring your potluck food to the pavilion
- Bring your own plates, utensils and drinks.
- Join the brunch and socialize!

1:00 Parade

- Drive your turnout into the arena for the judges.
- Then proceed directly to the starting line (row of cones)

1:15 THE EASTER EGG HUNT!

- Line up at the starting line (row of cones)
- Set down your basket by a cone.



When the whistle blows:

1. Drive out into the field to find an egg. **STOP.**
 2. One helper gets down, picks up one egg, and gets back into the carriage.
 3. Drive back to your basket at the starting line. **STOP.**
 4. One helper gets down, puts the egg in the basket, & gets back into the carriage.
- REPEAT steps 1 thru 4 for each egg.
 - After 40 minutes or so, the judge will announce that you may pick up as many eggs as you want.

When the whistle blows again:

- Hand in your basket full of eggs at the Pavilion
- Secure your horse and come to the Pavilion.

2:30 Awards

Come to the Pavilion for presentation of prizes!

- After the awards are given out, hard boiled eggs may be exchanged for candy-filled plastic eggs.
- Help clean up & thank the organizers and judges.



This is the perfect first drive of the season to remind your horse how to **STOP, STAND, and GO!**

PRIZES

- Best Turnout (whatever that means)
- Best Bonnet or Hat
- Best Egg Finder
- Locaters of 'Special Eggs'



RULES

- Entries may be any safe cart or carriage hitched to any size equine. No horse? Line driving is also ok.
- An equine must have a bridle with reins attached and passed through the turrets before it is hitched to a carriage.
- Helpers must mount and dismount only from STOPPED carriages and carts.
- Only one helper from your turnout on the ground at a time
- Walk or trot only, no cantering.
- Judges are here for fun and to help keep us safe. They are volunteers and their word is final. Please thank them.
- Drivers please keep your helpers out of harm's way.
- An unruly driver or equine will be invited off the field.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

We will host our Traditional Day of Driving on Saturday, 20 May 2017 at Thistle Hill Farm in Franktown, CO. The rain date will be Sunday, 21 May. If Sunday is not required as a rain date, we will host a relatively aggressive cross country drive on that date.

Our event judge this year will be Ms. Mickie Bowen of Unionville, Pennsylvania.

The start time is 10:30 am for presentation, followed by the pleasure drive (5.5 to 7.5 miles), beginning about 10:45 am and including three basic driving tests. The skilled driving test (cones) will follow the pleasure drive and should begin about 12:15 pm. All driving activity should finish between 2 & 3 pm depending on the total number participants.

A light lunch including beverages will be served in the courtyard and carriage house beginning about 2 pm. Following the completion of all driving activity, Ms. Bowen will provide commentary.

All participants must be members of the Colorado Driving Society. A single membership is \$25 and a family is \$30.

A buffet lunch including beer, wine, iced tea, soft drinks and coffee will cost \$20 per person. You are welcome to bring your own lunch and libations and to picnic on the grounds.

Except when preparing the vehicles and horses, we request that our dress code be observed at all times throughout the grounds. Gentlemen: coat, slacks, tie, hat, and gloves; Ladies: a dress, long skirt or slacks and blouse,



jacket, hat, and gloves. Grooms may be in formal or informal livery as fits the vehicle and turnout. A guest may serve as groom on appropriate vehicles. Whips must carry a whip and wear an appropriate driving apron.

All volunteers and non-riding guests will dress in similar fashion.

This event is open to horses and ponies only. Be sure to remember your number holders.

All whips, grooms, and guests will be asked to sign the Release on the following page.

We plan to use a standard track width for the skilled driving test (cones). The test will be driven at a trot and judged on time and balls down. We will group similar track widths together to minimize the resetting of cones so include the track width of your wheels on the entry form.

The course for the pleasure drive will include an "out and back" so that we will have the pleasure of passing and saluting each other, and an opportunity to appreciate the other turnouts. We will again have the ever popular beer and champagne stops.

It is our intention to make this event as inclusive as possible while observing the traditional standards of classical carriage driving. We wish this to be a fun and educational day celebrating our carriages, our horses, and our very special lifestyle. We look forward to seeing all of you.

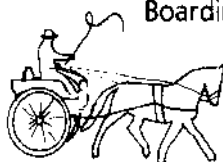
