
From 14th Street exit from I-25 (Loveland): Head west on 14th Street towards CR7, continue straight on 14th St SW, turn left onto S. Dotsero Dr, turn right onto SW 18th St/W Co Rd 16, turn left onto S Co Rd 19, continue onto W Co Rd 16, left into Raptor Ridge driveway.

⁴ Directions to Tara Weigle's Ranch, 40700 East 136th Ave, Hudson, CO: Hwy 85 to Bromley Lane in Brighton; east on Bromley Lane. (Once you get on Bromley Lane in Brighton, it is about 19 miles to Tara's place.) Bromley Lane changes back & forth from Bromley Lane to 152nd Ave. Just stay on it. At the roundabout, take the 2nd right, go over the bridge and keep going straight east approx. 9 miles. There will be an "S" curve to the right, 1 mile, then to the left. *Caution: sharp turns, slow down!* The road is now 144th Ave; keep going east for 4 miles, then take a right on Peterson Rd (29) (dirt for 1 mile). Then left on 136th Ave and turn left into the white gated drive (40700 E 136th Ave).



The Millers: An Equestrian Family

Susan Tyler

Terri Miller and her family received The Exceptional Award at the 2017 Blue Jeans Driving Games on August 20th. I called Terri to learn more about this equestrian family.

When deciding in which events to participate, or what carriage or horse to drive, Terri and her family choose what works best for activities the family can do together. That includes Terri and her husband Darrell, their daughter Amanda, Amanda's children Orrill and Clay, and supporting husband Duane Halvorson.

Blue Jeans Games

At this year's *Blue Jeans Games*, the Miller family placed in a total of fourteen classes driving eight different horses and four vehicles.

- Amanda took three first-place ribbons with Max in the horse division and took fifth place with four-in-hand ponies in the Gamblers Choice.
- Clay placed fifth with Duke in Town & Country, fourth with D'Arcy in A Flag and 16 Cones, and fourth with Duke in Pick Your Own Route.



- Orrill took third with Duke in the Road Maze Challenge, and fourth with Puzzle in Pick Your Own Route.
- Terri drove Puzzle in Road Maze Challenge to place third, took fourth with D'Arcy, then went on to drive Puzzle to place sixth in the Gambler's Choice.

The Homestead

Edwin Eugene Culver, a cattle rancher and Terri Miller's great grandfather, settled his homestead, Green Mountain Ranch, on Buffalo Creek in 1894.

As a child, Terri visited her grandmother on the family homestead, and there were always horses to ride. At a Fourth of July Picnic at the Homestead, an elderly neighbor named Harry Higginson arrived driving a donkey hitched to a cart. Terri was only 5 years old, but that sight made an impression on her. In the wagon shed was a Studebaker buggy in which Terri spent many childhood hours driving imaginary horses. Horses were always a part of her life, and the same has been true for her daughter Amanda, and for her grandchildren Clay and Orrill.

Amanda

At a year old, Amanda met a Budweiser Clydesdale and never forgot it. While in high school she bought her first Shire horse Thor, to ride and lat-



er drive. Her current riding and driving horse is Max, an 18H Shire stallion.

Amanda's first serious vehicle was a wagonette. She also drives a white Pony Victoria carriage, and a restored Plantation Phaeton. She often drives commercial carriages for other owners.





Currently Amanda and her family live on the family homestead in the original 1894 log cabin, now expanded to eight rooms.

Riding English

Twice during Terri's childhood, once at age 5-7, and later at 14-17, her family lived in England while her father was stationed at an Airforce Base there. They lived in a Manse surrounded by farm fields in the country, and Terri learned to ride English. She watched the local Squire's wife ride to the hounds sidesaddle, so of course she had to do that too, Terri and Amanda still ride sidesaddle on occasion!

Peruvian Horses

In 1978, as a young wife and mother, Terri was visiting her grandmother at the homestead and met a Buffalo Creek neighbor who invited her to ride his new Peruvian horse. She couldn't understand why anyone would pay \$5000 for a gelding he couldn't even breed-- until she rode him. He was so well trained, responding to the slightest aid almost before she gave it. She loved riding this horse. He was so delightful that she hadn't even noticed that he was gaited.

This neighbor turned out to be Wayne Ragsdale, the engineer who invented the seamless aluminum can for the Coors Brewery. Being quite well to do, he acquired a barn full of Peruvian horses and asked Terri to be their trainer. He brought in a Peruvian trainer to give her a week of intensive tutorial in the traditional Spanish method. When Wayne retired for health reasons, she moved on to train and show Peruvians for other owners.

Terri gained a real appreciation for these amazing horses, but came to understand that the novelty of the breed attracted wealthy, often elitist buyers who could afford these horses but

often knew nothing about Peruvians, or even horses in general, outside of a show ring.

Terri has bred, trained and sold Peruvian horses for 30 years, She most enjoys working with these fine horses in a more natural setting.

Dahlia

A few years back Terri decided she wanted to drive. She traded a filly for a miniature horse



named Dahlia, and Dahlia taught Terri to drive. Dahlia is a 9H, 23 year old power pony. You may have seen Terri wearing her bright yellow helmet driving Dahlia at the 2016 Derby; they flew around that course! Or Terri decked out in yellow with a parasol, driving Dahlia at the Easter Egg Hunt one year, She also likes to drive Dahlia in the Hyperbike.

"With your legs on either side, it's the closest you can get to riding a mini," Terri said.

For 2 or 3 years, Terri had been shopping for a four-wheeled pony vehicle. At the auction, this black and yellow Roberts wagonette came up for bid, but the bidding went so high so fast that Terri gave up, only to find afterward that Darrell had bought it for her!

Puzzle

Terri's horse Puzzle is half Peruvian and half Campolina, a Brazilian gaited cow horse. On the way to yet another Troyers Auction Darrell said, "Why don't you teach Puzzle to drive? She has such a good temperament." And here she is, hitched to her Hooded Gig.

- 4. For help recruiting volunteers, contact the volunteer coordinator* with a list of the positions to be filled (set-up, scribe, timer etc.) two months prior to the event
- 5. After your event, please send results, photos and a report to the newsletter editor.*
- 6. To be reimbursed by the club for an expense you incur, you must provide a receipt and a CDS reimbursement form, available on the CDS website.

Items that are donated require a receipt for the value of the item and the word "Donated" written on the receipt for tax purposes. This can include a judge's fee if the judge normally charges but chooses to donate the service to CDS.
