Road Maze Challenge

your 1st turn. Signal a Left Turn with your whip and proceed through the left turn. Continue down the path and signal Right Turn with your whip prior to making the right turn. In advance of the stop sign, signal a stop with your whip, then make a complete stop at the stop sign. Proceed down the road and cross the bridge. At the mailbox, stop & open the box to retrieve the letter, then return it to the box. Follow the road around the

Enter the course through the white pipe lined road to trash can, over the tarp on the ground, and past the flag. At the barrel with the flower basket, stop and pick up the basket, put it in your vehicle and proceed to the next barrel to make the delivery to your friend. This will complete the maze. One point awarded for executing the correct signal and/or passing successfully through the road challenge for a total of 10 points. Time will be used as a tie breaker.

Gambler's Choice

To be driven over a course of unnumbered obstacles, each carrying a specific point value, assigned according to its degree of difficulty. Each driver has the same allowed time to negotiate as many of the obstacles as possible, and try to amass as high a score as possible within that time allowed. After passing through the Start markers, the driver may drive through the obstacles, in any order and direction. Each obstacle may be driven twice, but not in succession. If driven a third time, no points are awarded. No obstacle may be redriven once it has been disturbed, except obstacles meant to be knocked down. No points are given for an incorrectly driven obstacle, but if incorrectly driven and

not disturbed, it may be attempted again. A signal sounds at the end of the allowed time, and the driver must then exit through the finish markers where the total time on course will be recorded. If already committed to an obstacle when the signal sounds, the driver may complete the obstacle and receive the points, then proceed to the finish. It is up to the judge to decide if the competitor was committed at the signal. Placings are determined by the greatest number of points accumulated in the least time. Obstacle may include a bridge, mail box to be opened, flag carried, 360 degree circle, parallel poles, various cones pairs in figures, back up knock down, and others.

Town & Country

After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line. Obstacles are set at 80 inches (2.0m) for all competitors. At least 30% of the obstacles must not be a pair of cones, but instead an obstacle that could be encountered while out driving through

town or country; i.e., mailbox and cones, trash barrel and cone, flagpole and a cone, fence section and cone, bridge, poles set like guardrails, wood piles, artificial animals (these should be set at a distance from a pair of cones to avoid frightening animals).

A Flag and 16 Cones

To be driven over a course of 16 numbered obstacles (paired markers) with a set route. After proceeding through the start markers, you will first need to head to the barrel with the flag, grab the flag

and continue with the flag through the numbered cones. Once all 16 cones have been completed, return the flag to the barrel and exit through the finish markers.

Pick Your Own Route

To be driven over a course of obstacles (paired markers) with no set route. The number of obstacles will not exceed 20 obstacles. The cones will be set at 80 inches at the start of the competition, and only reset in the event of a knockdown. After passing through the Start markers, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle to the designated Finish marker, choosing his/ her own route. Each obstacle and the start & finish lines to be negotiated once and only once, but may be driven from either direction. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis.

No salute is required before competing in any Obstacle Driving Class.

Penalties

Unless otherwise specified, the penalties shown at right will apply to all Time and Specialty Obstacle classes. Additional penalties will apply as specified in individual class rules

Timed Competitions

To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line. Course faults are assessed as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis.

Rules and Regulations

All classes offered will be conducted and judged in accordance with The American Driving Society rules and regulations, as much as possible and within reason.

Neither the management of the event nor the property owners of any property used during the event accept any responsibility for accidents, damage, injury or illness to the horses, owners, riders, driver, employees, attendants, spectators or any other person or property in connection with this event.

Driving Apparel:

In all classes the driver and any passengers should wear blue jeans and a hat (helmets are strongly encouraged). Drivers must wear gloves. Aprons and/or lap rugs are not required. An appropriate driving whip shall be carried at all times when driving. The whip thong must be able to reach the farthest horse/pony. In all classes drivers and passengers should be dressed neatly and appropriately for the class entered. Blue jeans (blue jeans skirts are acceptable for ladies). Junior drivers (under age 18) must wear an appropriate helmet at all times when driving.

NO CANTERING ALLOWED

Cantering Rule: Cantering is prohibited in all classes. Breaks to canter are defined as three full strides. Cantering will be penalized according to class specifications. In the case of multiples, all horses must break to incur penalties.

Junior Drivers/Passengers

Drivers under the age of 14, except those driving VSE/miniature horses, must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult horseman at all times.

Drivers or passengers under the age of 18 must wear a suitable helmet at all times when in the vehicle.

Qualifications

VSE: Under 9.3hh

Small pony: Over 9.3hh, not to exceed 12.2hh Large Pony: Over 12.2hh, not to exceed 14.2hh

Horse: Over 14.2hh

Multiples are sized based on their tallest member.

The pleasure driving horse may be any breed, color or size. Donkeys and mules of any size are welcomed and will be placed in classes based on their size as defined above.

Vehicle and Harness Requirements:

Any safe two- or four-wheeled vehicle is appropriate for this competition with the following exceptions:

Wire Wheel Vehicles (i.e. bicycle wheels) are allowed for VSE and Small Ponies only.

Vehicles may have iron or solid rubber tires or inflatable rubber tires.

Any type of harness is acceptable as long as it is safe and appropriate for the turnout. All harness should be clean and in good working order. Breaching is required for any vehicle without working brakes.

Check reins are not allowed in any of the classes.

Kicking or bucking straps are acceptable on all single turnouts.

Turnout Definitions and Groom Requirements:

Grooms/Passengers: must be at least 12 years of age. Grooms may be "recruited" from the volunteer pool if needed.

Single: one horse driving a 2- or 4-wheeled vehicle (groom optional)

Pair: two horses harnessed abreast driving a 2- or 4-wheeled vehicle (1 groom required)

Tandem: two horses harnessed in single file driving a 2-or 4-wheeled vehicle (1 groom required, except for VSE)

Unicorn: three horses harnessed one in front and two behind driving a 4-wheeled vehicle (2 grooms required, 1 groom for VSE)

Four-in-hand: four horses harnessed in pairs, two in front, two behind, driving a 4-wheeled vehicle (2 grooms required)

Splitting/Combining Classes: Class sections will be generally defined by the size and number of horses in each turnout as described above in Qualifications and Turnout Definitions. The Judge and/or Show Management reserve the right to split any class section, in the interest of safety, should the number of entries warrant such action. Class sections shall not be less than 3 turnouts. In the event that a class section does not fill, Management reserves the right to combine turnouts in any practical manner. Final class section designations will be provided on the day of the show. Junior drivers will be combined into their own class sections regardless of the size or type of the turnout.

Awards & Divisions

Ribbons will be awarded 1st to 6th place. Champions from each division, based on accumulated points, will receive a high point award. Divisions are VSE, Pony/ Donkey, and Horse/Draft/Mule.

BRIDLE RULE

A bridle with reins attached and passed through the saddle terrets must be in place whenever a horse is hitched to a vehicle. FAILURE TO COMPLY WILL INCUR ELIMINATION FROM THE EVENT

Dogs

Dogs must be on leash at all times.

Other Rules

Salisbury Park may have other rules posted that the participants are responsible for reading and following.

Lunch

Please choose your sandwich & cookie in the space provided on the entry form on page 6; lunch includes chips, and an apple. Water & sodas will be available for everyone.

Restroom facilities and water

There are several restroom facilities available on site.

Water for your horses is available at the maintenance building. This is a good distance from the event site, so it is recommended that you either bring your own water or stop on your way in to the event to pick some up.

How it works:

Each driver will be timed through a numbered course of obstacles and gates in the proper direction and in correct numerical order to the finish line. Drivers may enter horses of any breed and size, from minis to drafts, in different divisions and classes.

A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted into seconds. There will be two rounds for each competitor. The times plus penalty scores for both rounds are added to produce final scores and placing.

RULES

Divisions

- Training Level Division: trot only.
- Open division: any gait.

<u>Classes</u> refer to equine size; any equine breed may enter:

- VSE*/Small Pony (less than 12.2 hands) *very small equine
- Large Pony (12.2 to 14.2 hands)
- Horse (over 14.2 hands)

Presentation:

 Horses and riders must be turned out in clean and neat marathon style/

Navigators:

- All entries except VSE are required to have a navigator on the vehicle. Navigators may ride with more than one entry.
- Drivers under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a navigator of 18 years and older with the exception of VSE.
- Youth drivers over the age of 14 may drive single in VSE class.
- Drivers over age 18 must be accompanied by a navigator 14 years or over with the exception VSE.

Equipment:

- All persons on the course must wear properly fitted ASTM/ SEI protective headgear with chin strap harness secured.
 Protective vest and medical armbands are not required but recommended.
- Only the driver may handle the reins, brake and whip.
- A whip of suitable size to reach all horses must be carried in hand while on the course. If the whip is dropped, the driver or groom can retrieve a spare whip or the carriage must be stopped so a groom may dismount and retrieve the whip. In the case of a drivers without a groom, the whip may be restored to the driver by an outside party. The penalty is the time lost.

<u>Course</u>:

- A course diagram will be available upon check-in. Drivers will be invited to walk the course the morning of the event.
- Cones/Obstacles will be set at a common width of 175 cm.
- Hazards will be set at a minimum of 3 meters apart.
- The entry to each obstacle or gate will be numbered on the right by a red sign or flag, to indicate the correct direction.
 Entering an obstacle with the red sign or flag on the left or out of numerical order is an error and cause for elimination.
- Driving hazard gates out of order is "off course" and may be corrected by returning to the missed gate and resuming the course.
- Hazard gates completed are considered dead and can be driven in any direction.
- The judges' interpretation of the rules is final.

SCORING

- Course time begins and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start and finish lines.
- Penalties are added to the elapsed time for total time.
 Penalties are listed on page 13.
- Entry with lowest total time wins. This can be a combined time if multiple runs are used.
- Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty seconds or a drive off at management discretion.

Scoring

For those unfamiliar with the scoring used for driving trials, driving trials are three-phase events, with each phase using a different scoring system.

In dressage, the judge scores each movement with 10 being the highest possible score for a movement. Once the score for the entire test is calculated, a "magic formula" converts the dressage score into penalty points. Since these are now penalty points, the lower the score, the better.

In cones, each knockdown gets penalty points, as does any other error. If the driver exceeds the time allowed for the course, the excess time is converted to penalty points and added to any other penalties. A "double-clean" round (within the time allowed and no knockdowns or other errors) would have zero penalty points.

In marathon, driving and course errors and exceeding the time allowed or being more than three minutes faster than the time allowed all get penalty points. Training level drivers who are within the three-minute window and who have no course errors would have zero penalty points. Drivers at all other levels will also earn penalty points for every second spent in a course obstacle, so they cannot have a zero score, but as in dressage, are after the lowest score possible.

The total penalties for all three phases of the competition determine the placings, with the lowest score earning the highest placing.

Reminders for Event Organizers:

- 1. Guidelines for organizers, a sample budget, and reimbursement forms are available on the CDS web site. They're on the right hand side in the "Event Planning" section; click on "Files." [Or since the web site is about to undergo some reconstruction, send an email to coloradodrivingsociety@gmail.com, and we'll get you the forms you need.]
- 2. If your event budget is within the amount set in the annual club budget, proceed with publicity for your event. If your budget exceeds the amount allotted, contact the Event Coordinator. Keep all receipts for event expenses to submit with a final accounting of event expenses and income after the event. (For donations to the event, please submit a receipt for the value of the item and the word "Donated" written on the receipt for tax purposes. This can include a judge's fee if the judge normally charges but chooses to donate the service to CDS.)
- 3. Submit a description of the event to the newsletter editor 2.5 months prior to the month in which the event is scheduled. Include event title, date, time, location, rain date, fees, organizer, details of the event, closing date for entries & where to send fee & registration. If applicable, also include clinician, rules, liability release, and volunteers needed. (Please send content in an email with minimal formatting. The editor will take care of the layout.)
- 4. For help recruiting volunteers, contact the Volunteer Coordinator with a list of the positions to be filled (set-up, scribe, timer etc.) two months prior to the event
- 5. After your event, please send results, photos and a report to the newsletter editor.
- 6. To be reimbursed by the club for an expense you incur, you must provide a receipt and a CDS reimbursement form, available on the CDS website.
