It included 12 sets of cones, a "bridge" and two complex hazards of traffic barrels.* With two classes, open and training, and the full range of horse sizes, spectators enjoyed watching as drivers negotiated the course at a variety of speeds.

Especially fun to watch were Geir Kanstad driving his pair of Shetlands at full tilt (tho' Roberta Greeno still beat him), Terry Miller driving her speedy Toby in a mini sulky, and Lisa Crispin driving Ernest, her mini donkey, in their first event.

Comments from Erik: We had a great crew come out to set up the course Saturday morning. The Park staff had the polo ground mowed and ready for us. Returning after being inactive to the club for some years, I was impressed by how everyone pitched in. After the last competitor ran the course, folks took down the cones and hazards in a matter of minutes! Everyone cleaned up after their horses and left the park as we found it. Let's do it again next year!

Special kudos to Pat Lamprey: When I picked up the club trailer, all the equipment was in perfect order.

Many thanks to the stalwart volunteers, without whom we could not put on this event. Jan Wehrli was our announcer. Joe Johnson judged. Norb Nothstein timed, and took photographs. Kevin Russell saw to the course, resetting cones and barrels whenever needed. Pat Lamprey was our scorekeeper. Chris Jensen, Rita Nothstein and Abby and Emily Driesen kept a sharp eye on the competitors as they negotiated the hazards. We were all glad to see Fred Wehrli right in the midst of the activity, finally home from the hospital and awaiting his new feet, and retaking the reins as president of the Colorado Driving Society.

The marathon will consist of no more than 4 obstacles with 3 gates each. Obstacles will not be timed individually, but time in the obstacles will count towards the total marathon time. Marathon speeds: Horses 13 kph; ponies 12 kph; small ponies 11 kph; VSE 9 kph. Cones speeds: Horses & ponies 180 mpm; VSE 160 mpm.; no cantering in any phase of the event, including cones.

PRELIMINARY: Recommended for horses and drivers with some prior competition experience and who would like to further their training experience and training program. The tests encourage development of basic gaits, obedience, suppleness and balance. Entries will drive *ADS Preliminary Level Dressage Test 3, 1994.* The marathon will consist of up to 4 timed obstacles with up to 4 gates. Marathon speeds: Horses 14 kph; ponies 13 kph; small ponies 12 kph; VSE 9 kph. Cones speeds: Horses & ponies 200 mpm; VSE 180 mpm.

GENERAL RULES

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SUBMITTING ENTRIES.

- 1. A bridle with reins attached and passed through the saddle terrets must be in place when ever a horse is put to a vehicle. Failure to comply will incur elimination.
- 2. The 20 Mile House Combined Driving Trial will be conducted and judged according to American Driving Society rules insofar as possible.
- 3. Neither the management of the event, the Organizing Committee, the Show Committee, nor the property owners of any property used during the event accept any responsibility for accidents, damage, injury or illness to the horses, owners, riders, driver, employees, attendants, spectators or any other person or property in connection with this competition.
- 4. HARNESS AND VEHICLES MUST BE IN GOOD CONDITION, SAFE, uniform in appearance, and of an accepted style. Vehicles may have iron or solid rubber tires. Pneumatic tires will be allowed at all levels for Very Small Equines. Pneumatic tires will be allowed for horse and pony vehicles in Training Level only. Vehicles, harnesses or equipment that are found to be unsafe will not be allowed to compete or remain in use during the event.

5. ALL DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH AT ALL TIMES! (Better yet, leave them home!)

- 6. ADS veterinary and cruelty rules will be observed. If during the show an animal is deemed unfit to continue, this decision, under the aegis of the judge, will be final.
- 7. Junior drivers under 14 years of age, except those driving VSE/miniature horses, must be accompanied in the carriage by a knowledgeable adult horseperson. Failure to comply will incur elimination.
- 8. A groom/navigator is required for all turn-outs on the marathon, except for VSE competitors aged 14 or older. Additional passengers are permitted. Groom/navigators must be at least 12 years of age.
- 9. Breeching and/or brakes are required for the marathon.

10. HARD HATS are required for the marathon.

11. Groom/navigators may ride more than once if scheduling permits. A driver may compete with more than one turnout if scheduling permits. A driver may ride as groom/navigator for another competitor if scheduling permits.

- 7. If you incur an expense that needs to be repaid out of the club's checkbook you must provide a receipt.
