Beginning Dressage Clinic

Sunday, June 7, 2015

We had blue skies and pleasant temperatures, but a soggy polo field at the June 7th dressage clinic at Salisbury Equestrian Park. The dressage ring was set up in the white arena which had a smooth firm sandy surface.

There were five participants who enjoyed the time dressage judge and trainer, Laura Ware spent evaluating and recommending suggestions to improve our performance in the dressage ring. We took turns driving a dressage test we had selected and brought with us. Laura evaluated our performance and then fitted us with a headset so she could talk to us as we drove and coached us through various movements. It was a very positive experience.

Thanks so much to Pat Lamprey for suggesting Laura Ware as the clinician. Laura's calm, informative methods were wonderful. The binder full of dressage information compiled by Pat and Laura and copies presented to each of the participants should become part of the CDS library. .

Cones and Hazards Fun Day

Marie Harrity set up a cones course, a serpentine cones series, a box and a hazard of barrels. She also provided a packet of information and a map of the course. Participants could try the course as often as they liked. They also drove trails through the lower area of the park where there are several hazards, and a covered bridge.

Divisions and Class Specifications:

TRAINING: Recommended for competitors beginning combined driving competition. It is an introduction to the sport for horse and driver. The tests acquaint competitors with the basic gaits, figures, and obstacles that are the foundation of all Combined Driving Events. Entries will drive ADS [Training Level Dressage Test 4 1994](#).*

The marathon will consist of no more than 4 obstacles with 3 gates each. Obstacles will not be timed individually, but time in the obstacles will count towards the total marathon time. Marathon speeds: Horses 13 kph; Ponies 12 kph; Small Ponies 11 kph; VSE 9 kph. Cones speeds: Horses & ponies 180 mpm; VSE 160 mpm. (No cantering in any phase of the event, including cones.)

PRELIMINARY: Recommended for horses and drivers with some prior competition experience and who would like to further their training experience and training program. The tests encourage development of basic gaits, obedience, suppleness and balance. Entries will drive ADS [Preliminary Level Dressage Test 3, 1994](#).* The marathon will consist of up to 4 timed obstacles with up to 4 gates. Marathon speeds: Horses 14 kph; Ponies 13 kph; Small Ponies 12 kph; VSE 9 kph. Cones speeds: Horses & Ponies 200 mpm; VSE 180 mpm.

DIVISIONS AND CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

TRAINING: Recommended for competitors beginning combined driving competition. It is an introduction to the sport for horse and driver. The tests acquaint competitors with the basic gaits, figures, and obstacles that are the foundation of all Combined Driving Events. Entries will drive *ADS Training Level Dressage Test 4, 1994*. The marathon will consist of no more than 4 obstacles with 3 gates each. Obstacles will not be timed individually, but time in the obstacles will count towards the total marathon time. Marathon speeds: Horses 13 kph; ponies 12 kph; small ponies 11 kph; VSE 9 kph. Cones speeds: Horses & ponies 180 mpm; VSE 160 mpm.; no cantering in any phase of the event, including cones.

PRELIMINARY: Recommended for horses and drivers with some prior competition experience and who would like to further their training experience and training program. The tests encourage development of basic gaits, obedience, suppleness and balance. Entries will drive *ADS Preliminary Level Dressage Test 3, 1994*. The marathon will consist of up to 4 timed obstacles with up to 4 gates. Marathon speeds: Horses 14 kph; ponies 13 kph; small ponies 12 kph; VSE 9 kph. Cones speeds: Horses & ponies 200 mpm; VSE 180 mpm.

GENERAL RULES

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SUBMITTING ENTRIES.

- 1. A bridle with reins attached and passed through the saddle terrets must be in place when ever a horse is put to a vehicle.** Failure to comply will incur elimination.
- The 20 Mile House Combined Driving Trial will be conducted and judged according to American Driving Society rules insofar as possible.
- Neither the management of the event, the Organizing Committee, the Show Committee, nor the property owners of any property used during the event accept any responsibility for accidents, damage, injury or illness to the horses, owners, riders, driver, employees, attendants, spectators or any other person or property in connection with this competition.
- HARNESS AND VEHICLES MUST BE IN GOOD CONDITION, SAFE, uniform in appearance, and of an accepted style. Vehicles may have iron or solid rubber tires. Pneumatic tires will be allowed at all levels for Very Small Equines. Pneumatic tires will be allowed for horse and pony vehicles in Training Level only. Vehicles, harnesses or equipment that are found to be unsafe will not be allowed to compete or remain in use during the event.
- 5. ALL DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH AT ALL TIMES! (Better yet, leave them home!)**
- ADS veterinary and cruelty rules will be observed. If during the show an animal is deemed unfit to continue, this decision, under the aegis of the judge, will be final.
- Junior drivers under 14 years of age, except those driving VSE/minature horses, must be accompanied in the carriage by a knowledgeable adult horseperson. Failure to comply will incur elimination.
- A groom/navigator is required for all turn-outs on the marathon**, except for VSE competitors aged 14 or older. Additional passengers are permitted. **Groom/navigators must be at least 12 years of age.**
- Breeching and/or brakes are required for the marathon.
- 10. HARD HATS are required for the marathon.**
- Groom/navigators may ride more than once if scheduling permits. A driver may compete with more than one turnout if scheduling permits. A driver may ride as groom/navigator for another competitor if scheduling permits.

On show day, we're happy to have you for all or just part of the day. Either way, we'll feed you—and thank you!

Reminders for Event Organizers:

1. Guidelines for organizers, a sample budget, and reimbursement forms are available on the CDS web site. They're on the right hand side in the "Documents" section below the newsletters.
2. Three months before your event, submit a budget to the CDS board: No publicity for an event will be released until the *board* has approved the budget for the event, so get that in first!
3. Two and a half months before your event, submit a description of your event to the newsletter. Include title, date, time, location, rain date, fees, organizer, details of the event, closing date for registration, a registration form and where to send it.
4. If you need help recruiting volunteers, send a list of the volunteers you need (scribe, timer etc.) to the volunteer coordinator, Susan Tyler.
5. After your event, Please send results and a report to the newsletter editor: SusanHTyler@gmail.com; or Susan Tyler, 755 Vista Lane, Lakewood, CO 80215
6. Sending a few pictures is very desirable!
7. If you incur an expense that needs to be repaid out of the club's checkbook you must provide a receipt. There is a form available for this on the website, and we will have them at the membership meetings. We will also provide copies in the Organizer's Packet. Receipts are required to keep our books in order.

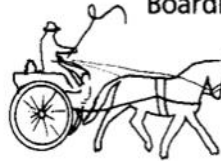
